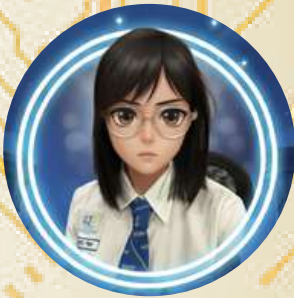

It's a meaningful moment to support one another spiritually, lifting up each student's wellbeing and reminding them they are not alone in their journey.

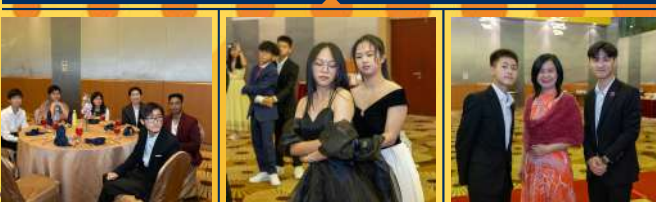

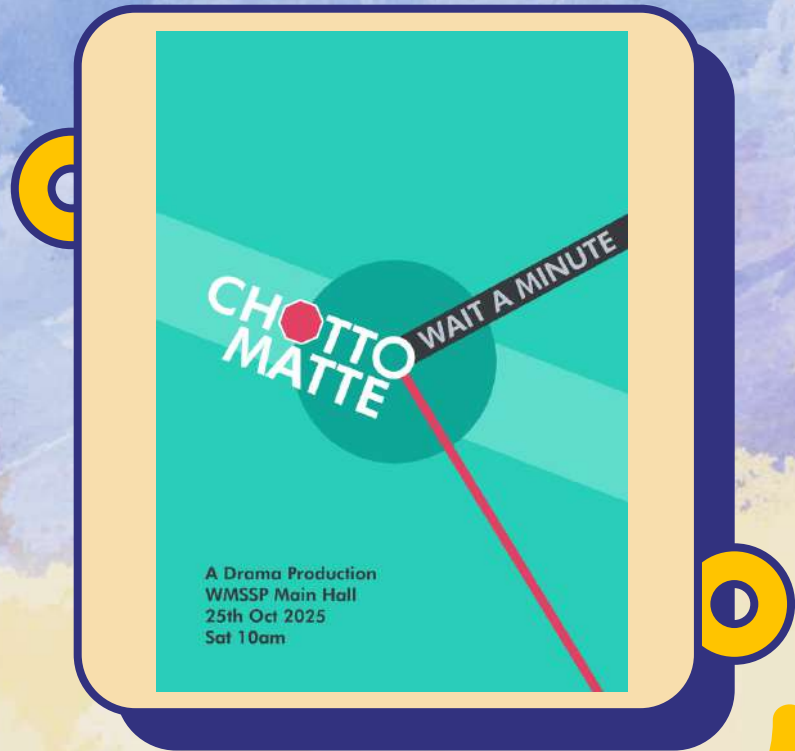

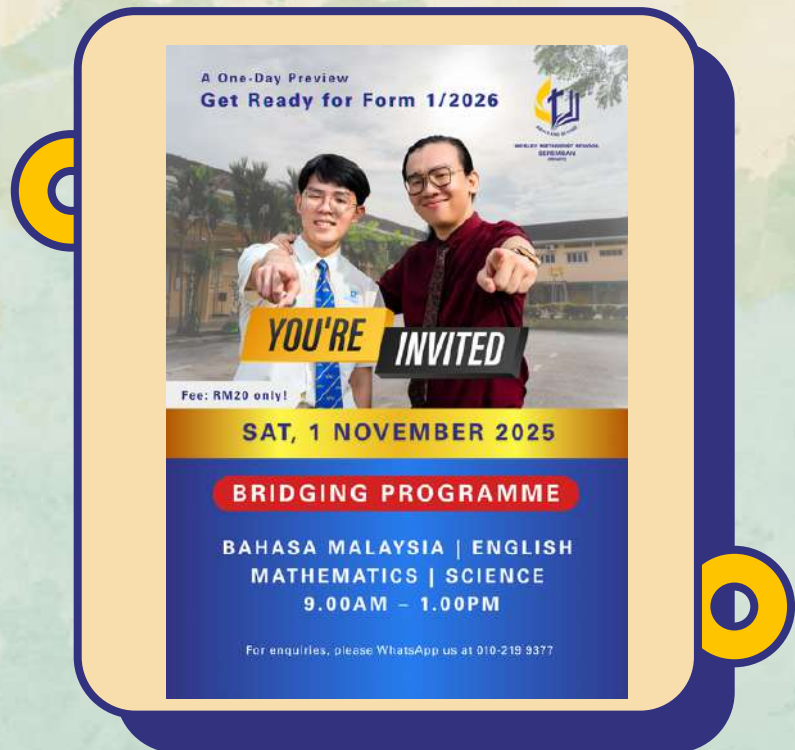
